FAIRVIEW STUDENTS MAKE A DIFFERENCE!

In a unique joint venture, over 100 Fairview High School football players joined Troop 78 boy scouts to improve the trails and banks around the Kids' Fishing Ponds. In May, when Fairview head coach, Tom McCartney, announced that the team would perform a community service project, no one knew what he had in mind. Greg Krumel, a junior varsity player and Troop 78 Life Scout, volunteered to lead the team's first annual community service project. With a shrinking budget, Lisa Green, Urban Parks Manager for the City of Boulder's Parks and Recreation Department, embraced the idea of working with Greg on his Eagle community service project. The team's muscle and energy provided Lisa and Greg with the opportunity to take on a more physically demanding service effort.

By the end of the day, the football players and scouts repaired eroded pond banks, shored up running paths between the ponds and creek, painted benches and cleared truck loads of tree trimmings. With the elimination of uneven edges and depressions, soft surface path users, walkers, runners, wheelchair users, will enjoy newly resurfaced paths around the ponds and along the Boulder Creek Path. Cyclists will benefit from the lower pedestrian volume on the paved Creek Path, making it safer for all users. But it is the young anglers who the youth are really aiming to help with safer pond banks, freshly painted benches, cleared brush and resurfaced paths.

The ponds are a well-hidden jewel along the Boulder Creek, just east of 6th and Canyon. Boulder Fish and Game Club created the "Evert Pierson Kids' Fishing Ponds" in 1949 from old University of Colorado gravel pits. Boulder Fish and Game continues to maintain the ponds, stocking over 3,000 fish each year between Memorial It is impossible to estimate the far-reaching impact of this pond, of how many of its "kids" have grown into regular anglers. But they are many. And the club is extremely proud of how the kids' pond has secured a place in Boulder's unique culture.
