The Boulder Valley School District intends to apply to the Colorado Department of Education for a 21<sup>st</sup> Century Learning Center grant, on behalf of Alicia Sanchez International Elementary School in Lafayette, Colorado, and Emerald Elementary School in Broomfield, Colorado. These are multi-year federally-sourced grants.

If funded, this grant will continue and expand out-of-school time (after, before, summer school) programs for children in Grades K-5, and their parents/families. The Learning Centers located at these schools may provide academic support, such as tutoring, academic enrichment (e.g. STEM, arts, physical activities/sports, etc.), and parent education and involvement programming (ESL, parenting, etc.). Services are designed to meet the needs of low-income, immigrant, English-learner, disabled, and/or homeless students, children of color, and other underserved or at-risk pupils, and their parents. The Centers <u>do not</u> provide daily child care or summer school.

Children attending Grades K-5 in nonpublic schools that are near Sanchez and Emerald elementary schools, or who live in neighborhoods adjacent to these schools, may be eligible to participate in their Learning Center programs, under the 'equitable services' provisions of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act.
